Further Study:

We read Jesus' words of challenge: we must become like Jesus, follow his pattern.

Christlikeness must be our whole goal.

We cannot achieve this on our own. We must depend on Jesus. We need grace. Grace comes to the humble.

Humility is the key to dependence. Pride creates independence. Independence from Jesus, the Head and independence from the Church, his Body.

He calls us to a love that lays down its life, a humility that serves, and a willingness to be part of His Body, having a healthy dependence on others.

Call to humility:

Philippians 2:3-8

did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness.

⁸ And being found in appearance as a man,

he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross!

Reliance on Jesus:

2 Peter 1:3

3 His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness.

2 Corinthians 12:9

9 But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me.

³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

⁶ Who, being in very nature^[a] God,

⁷ rather, he made himself nothing

John 15:1-5

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes^[a] so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

Jesus the Head:

Colossians 1:15-23a

¹⁵ The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. ¹⁶ For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. ¹⁷ He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. ¹⁸ And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

Being part of the Body:

1 Corinthians 12: 21-27

(Following in that chapter: Gifts, and then the greatest is love in 1 Cor. 13)

The way of love (and its source):

1 John 4:7-21

John 15:13

13 Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.

⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" ²⁶ If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

²⁷ Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

⁷ Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God.

¹⁶ And so we know and rely on the love God has for us.

¹⁹ We love because he first loved us.

Submission in relationships:

1 Peter 5:1-7

5 To the elders among you, I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: ² Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care, watching over them—not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; ³ not lording it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock. ⁴ And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.

"God opposes the proud but give grace to the humble." [a]

Ephesians 5

5 ¹ Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children ² and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Goes on with parallels between love/submission relationship between Christ and church/body and husband and wife: "in the same way"

<u>Letting each other into our messes</u>:

James 5:13-16

¹³ Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. ¹⁴ Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

⁵ In the same way, you who are younger, submit yourselves to your elders. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because,

⁶ Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.

²¹ Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.
