Forbearing God, bring patience and new visions of fathering to them.

We pray for those who have placed children up for adoption.

We pray for those who long to be reunited with children they barely know.

God, who created fathers, who came as a child and had earthly and heavenly fathers,


God, who loves us with a more complete and deeper love than we have ever known,






Discern is to Pay Attention
